Definition of a Candidate

COLORADO CONSTITUTION ARTICLE XXVIII (Amendment 27)

Section 2 (2) ""Candidate" means any person who seeks nomination or election to any state or local public office that is to be voted on in this state at any primary election, General Election, school district election, special district election, or municipal election. 'Candidate' also includes a judge or justice of any court of record who seeks to be retained in office pursuant to the provisions of section 25 of article VI. A person is a candidate for election if the person has publicly announced an intention to seek election to public office or retention of a judicial office and thereafter has received a contribution or made expenditure in support of the candidacy. A person remains a candidate for purposes of this Article so long as the candidate maintains a registered candidate committee. A person who maintains a candidate committee after an election cycle, but who has not publicly announced an intention to seek election to public office in the next or any subsequent election cycle, is a candidate for purposes of this article.

Basic Qualifications for County Offices

The table below provides a general overview of candidate qualifications for County elected offices and should be used for reference only. Please review the Colorado Constitution and Colorado Revised statutes for current applicable laws. Please note that no person is eligible to be a candidate for more than one office at a time, except for special district boards.

Steps for Candidacy

The following are recommended steps to become a candidate for elected office in Chaffee County Government, including Assessor, Clerk and Recorder, Commissioner, Coroner, Sheriff

and Treasurer. There are three possible ways to get certification of designation as a candidate

on the ballot: petition, party assembly nomination, or write-in. These processes are described

briefly below. For detailed information, please see Colorado Revised Statutes Title 1, Article 4

Step 1 — Confirm Eligibility

Review office qualifications in the Colorado Constitution and C.R.S.Review the candidate

requirements and office responsibilities and duties of county elected offices in the Colorado

Constitution and Colorado Revised Statutes and ensure you meet the qualifications. These may

be found online at www.lexisnexis.com/hottopics/Colorado/. You will be required to swear and

affirm by oath that you meet the qualifications for county elected office in a Candidate Affidavit

(Step 3).

Step 2 — Verify Voter Registration

Check your voter registration status, affiliation, and dates at:

govotecolorado.gov

Step 3 — File a Candidate Affidavit

• Must be filed within 10 days of becoming a candidate.

Filed electronically with the Colorado Secretary of State.

Step 4 — Register a Candidate Committee

You must register a committee before accepting any contributions.

Certificate of Designation by Petition

The petition process involves circulating a written petition to other eligible electors and obtaining their signature in support of your candidacy. See Colorado Revised Statutes Title 1, Article 4, Part 8 on Nomination of Candidates by Petition.

- Unaffiliated candidates <u>must</u> get on the ballot through the petition process. There is no
 assembly or primary election for unaffiliated candidates. Unaffiliated candidates
 nominated by petition are placed directly on the General Election ballot. An unaffiliated
 candidate must be registered as unaffiliated no later than the first business day of
 January immediately preceding the election for which the person desires to be placed in
 nomination.
- Affiliated candidates (major or minor party) may use the petition option, in addition to
 or as an alternative to the assembly process. However, a candidate may not petition onto
 the ballot if they have attempted and failed to receive at least 10 percent of the votes for
 nomination for the same office at their party's assembly. A candidate must be affiliated
 with the political party no later than the first business day of January immediately
 preceding the election for which the person desires to be placed in nomination.

Petition Circulation

The Chaffee County Elections Office provides a sample petition (through our forms online), or a candidate may create his or her own following the requirements in Colorado Revised Statutes Title 1, Article 4, Part 901 and 902. **The County Clerk must approve all petition formats prior to circulation.**

After collecting signatures, the completed petition must be filed with the Chaffee County Elections Office by the statutory deadline (see chart below for deadlines). The Election Office will verify the signatures and notify the candidate of sufficiency or insufficiency of the petition.

Requirements for Petition Circulators and Signers

Major Party / Minor Party / Unaffiliated - C.R.S. 1-4-905 and 905.5

Circulators Must:

- Be U.S. citizens
- Be at least 18
- Personally witness signatures
- Complete and sign the circulator affidavit
- Not pay signers

Signers Must:

- Be eligible electors of the district
- Follow party affiliation rules (for major parties)
- Sign only one petition per office

Signature Requirements

Major Parties:

Lesser of 1,000 signatures or 10% of votes cast in the last primary

Minor Parties & Unaffiliated:

Lesser of 1,000 signatures or 2% of votes cast in the last general election

Certificate of Designation by Party Assembly

Major and minor party candidates may seek nomination to run for office at their political party's assembly. Candidates who want to be a part of this process should contact their political party for assembly protocol, dates and rules. You must be registered as affiliated with that party no later than the first business day of January of the election year, unless party rules state otherwise. At the assembly, the Party delegates vote on the candidates, and:

- Major party candidates nominated by assembly are placed on the Primary Election ballot.
- Minor party candidates nominated by assembly are placed on the general election ballot unless there is more than one candidate for that office nominated by assembly and/or petition; then the candidates are placed on the Primary Election ballot.

Party Assembly Deadlines

• Last day for precinct caucuses: March 7, 2026

Assembly designations: March 2 – April 2, 2026

• Certificates of Designation due: 4 days after adjournment

• Candidate Acceptance forms due: 4 days after adjournment

Major Party Petition Deadlines- C.R.S 1-4-801 and 904

• First day to circulate petitions: January 2, 2026

• Last day to file with the County Clerk: March 18, 2026, by 4:00 p.m.

Minor Party Petition Deadlines C.R.S 1-4-801 and 904

- First day to circulate: January 2, 2026
- Filing deadline: April 6, 2026, by 4:00 p.m.
 (Per SOS Calendar)

Unaffiliated Petition Deadlines C.R.S 1-4-801 and 904

- First day to circulate: May 14, 2026
- Filing deadline: July 9, 2026, by 3:00 p.m.

Write-In Deadlines

- Primary Write-In Affidavit deadline: April 24, 2026
- General Write-In Affidavit deadline: July 16, 2026

If you receive your party's nomination, a Certificate of Designation by Assembly must be filed by the political party with the County Clerk and Recorder no later than four (4) days after the adjournment of the assembly. [1-4-604(3) and 1-4-1304(3) C.R.S.] Certificates of Designation may be transmitted electronically; however, the original certificate must also be filed and postmarked no later than ten (10) days after the adjournment of the assembly. Each candidate designated by assembly must file a written acceptance of designation with the County Clerk and Recorder within four (4) days after the adjournment of the assembly, and if the acceptance is transmitted by fax, the original acceptance must be postmarked no later than ten (10) days after the adjournment of the assembly. [1-4-601(3) and 1-4-1304(4) C.R.S.] The written acceptance of designation for candidates can be found through our forms online.

Certificate of Designation by Write-In

A write-in candidate is a candidate whose name does not appear on the ballot, but for whom voters may vote nonetheless by writing in the person's name. Any person who wishes to be a write-in candidate must file an Affidavit of Intent stating which office the candidate desires and that they are qualified to assume those duties if elected. The Affidavit of Intent can be found online and shall be filed with the Chaffee County Elections Office

by the close of business on the 67th day before a primary election or by the close of business on the 110th day before any other election. C.R.S 1-4-1101 and 1102.

Withdrawal Process

If NOT yet nominated:

Submit a signed withdrawal letter to the County Clerk.

If ALREADY nominated or designated:

Submit a notarized Statement of Withdrawal.

If submitted too late for ballot removal, votes will not be counted.

- Secretary of State: Candidate Affidavit, Committee Registration, Finance Reports

WHEN do I file my petition and certificate of designation for the County office?
